

# Jacket "Teddy"

## Model 321-14

### Size 36–48



#### PRINT THE CUT

1. Open the pattern PDF and set the control square to Page 1 with the setting "Original size" on DIN Print A4 paper (US-Letter). (Do not click on "Adjustment to page size"!)
2. Check the square – if it is 10×10 cm, print out the whole cut sheet.
3. Place all pages next to each other as indicated by the arrows and adhere them row by row along the boundary lines, then glue the rows together.
4. Compare the body measurements with the table measurements and cut out the cut parts in the appropriate size. (The overview of the cut parts is on the pattern sheet.)

**Important:** Instructions do not include seam allowances, unless otherwise indicated!

#### CUTTING OUTER FABRIC

- 1 2× front part
- 1 2× facing
- 2 1× back part on the fold
- 3 1× upper collar on the fold
- 4 1× lower collar on the fold
- 5 2× collar stand on the fold
- 6 2× sleeve

**Tip:** We recommend allowances of 4 cm on all hems of the outer fabric and 2 cm of the lining.

#### CUTTING LINING

Add an approx. 3–4 cm wide pleat for ease on the front part up to the facing line and on the back part along the rear centre by placing the pattern piece 1.5–2 cm off the fold. Also cut the sleeves.

#### SUPPLIES

- 1.3–1.4 m micro fleece, 155 cm wide
- Lining, 140 cm wide
- Woven interlining G 785 (Vlieseline)
- 4 Metal snap buttons, 23 mm

#### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Iron woven interlining on the lower collar, on one of the collar stands and on the facing. With the very soft original fabric we also reinforced all hems and the neckline edges. Close all darts on the sleeves, the front and the back parts. Carefully pull the hairs out of the seams with a needle. Close the shoulder and the side seams.
2. **Collar:** Sew one collar stand each to the upper and the lower collar; see the marking "heart". Sew the outer edges of the collar from marking "cross" to marking "cross". Turn the collar over and pull the hairs out of the

seam. Pin the lower edges of the collar stand on top of each other. Sew the collar to the neckline so that the upper collar will be on the top later.

3. **Lining:** Close the rear pleat for ease at the top, at the waist and from the hem for approx. 4 cm each. Close all darts and side seams. Sew the front facings on the lining. Close the shoulder seams.
4. Close the sleeve seams of the outer fabric. Close one of the lining sleeves completely, the other only at the top and the bottom for approx. 8 cm. Gather the top shaping of the outer fabric and the lining and sew in all sleeves.
5. Sew the outer edges of the jacket and the facings right side on right side together, starting from the lower edge of the facing via the front edge and the neckline up to the lower edge of the facing on the other side. Cut back the allowances in layers and clip them along the curves.  
**Tip:** To sew the facing on the hem of the front part, sew the corner on the sewing line and then sew the lower edge of the facing slightly pulled down on the hem of the jacket. Continuously stitch the hems of the outer fabric and lining. Turn jacket over through the opening in the lining sleeve.
6. Pull the lining sleeve wrong side on wrong side into the sleeve of the outer fabric. Pin the sleeve hems of the outer fabric and lining seam to seam on top of each other, pull them through the opening in the lining sleeve to the inside and sew them together right side on right side. Sew the hems of the jacket and the sleeves by hand or with a Blindstitch on the sewing machine. Sew on the snap buttons.



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
